Wordsworth gave us his magnificent evocations of English nature and unbridled passion for his country: Nor, England! did I know till then/ What love I bore to thee...

John Masefield in the last century wrote unforgettable sea poems in which you could feel the spray in your face and the wind like a 'whetted knife' — as well as the irresistible lure of the ocean: I must go down to the sea again, to the lonely sea and the sky...

- 15 Alfred, Lord Tennyson left us his Charge Of The Light Brigade, about the mad but magnificent dash for the Russian guns cannon that 'volleyed and thundered' about them as our light cavalrymen galloped headlong 'into the jaws of Death, into the mouth of Hell' during the Crimean War.
- Now we are reduced to Carol Ann Duffy writing about small, soon-to-beobsolete domestic appliances. No wonder people have so little time for poetry any more. [...]
  - It was always the traditional job of the Poet Laureate to glorify Britain, to praise the heroes of our long and colourful history, to show loyalty to the monarchy and mark royal weddings and birthdays. [...]

The truth is our pinko Poets Laureate (as they are pedantically called) are in an impossible situation. How can they fulfil their role as national poets?

In the fractured, polyglot, multicultural country we inhabit today, they have no idea what it means to be British.
